Susanna Greer, daughter of the late Andrew and Amanda Bowles was born July 18, 1898 in Stanton, Tennessee, Haywood County. One of 13 Children to this matrimonial union.

Susanna at early age joined Douglas Chapel C.M.E. Church. While attending Douglas Chapel she was active in many church functions. She had a beautiful voice and sang in the Gospel Choir.
