hallowed be thy name.*

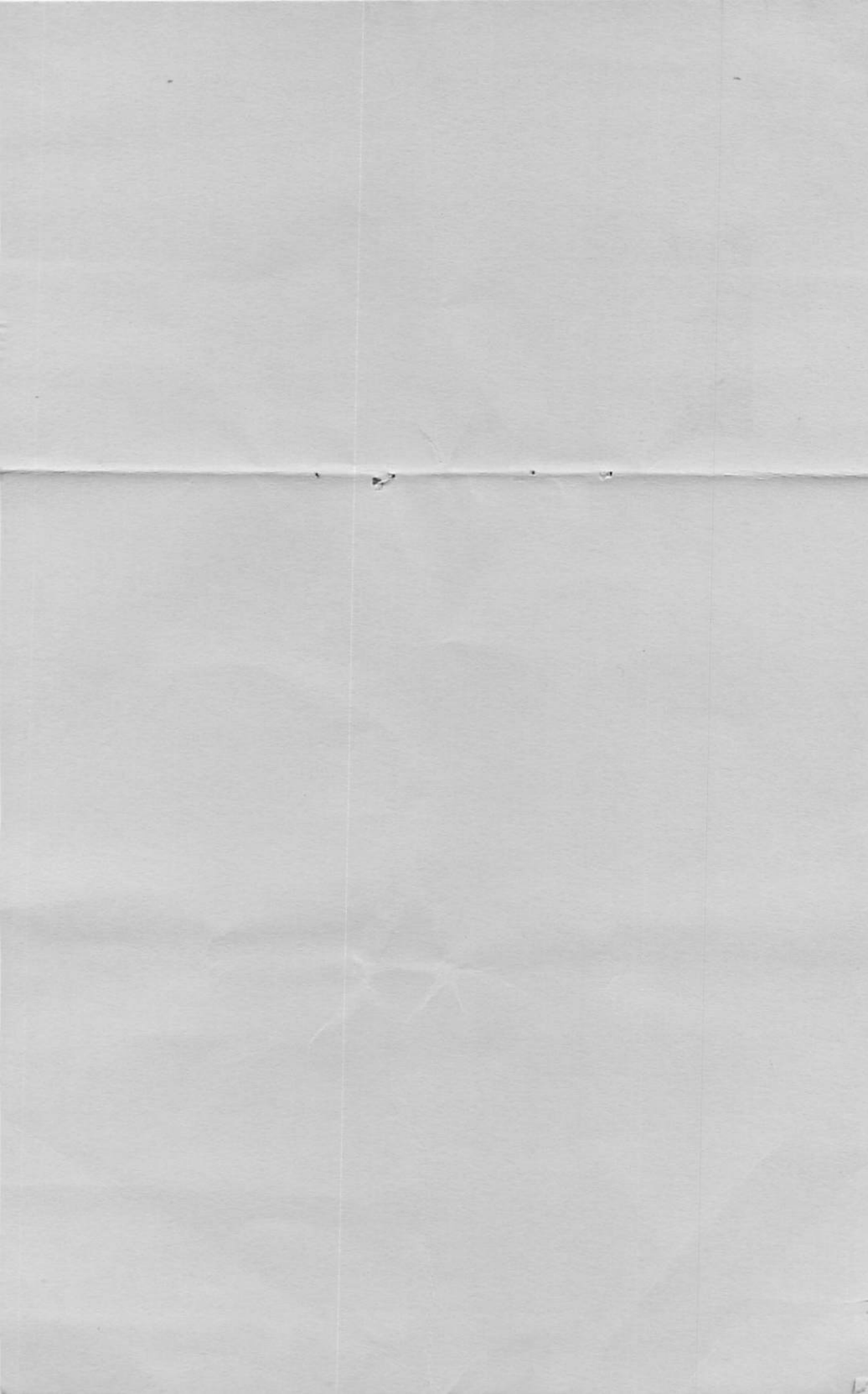
