She professed a hope in Christ at an early age and united the Dancyville C.M.E. Church.

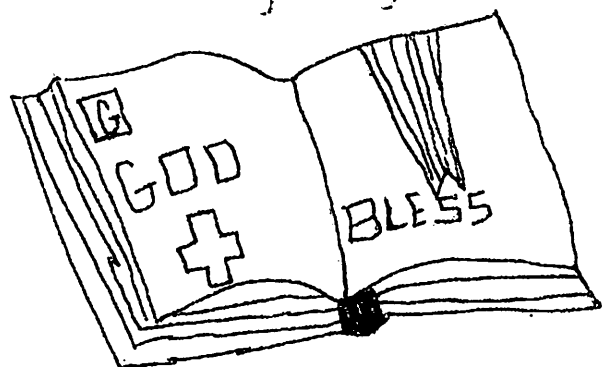
She was united in marriage to George Hames, Sr. who preceded her in death on June 2, 1980.
