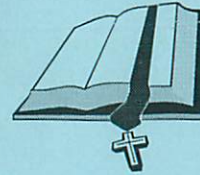

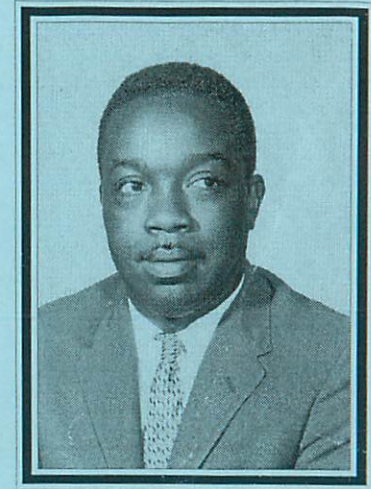

On May 12, 1927, in Haywood County, Tennessee, J. C. was the first born to Booker T. and Bertha Thaxton Bond.

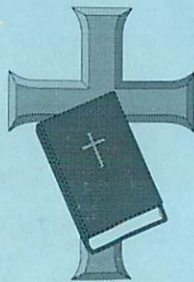
J. C. attended public school in Haywood County and united with Browns Creek Missionary Baptist Church at an early age.
