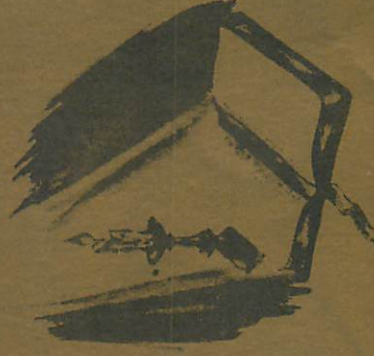

to be a happy one.

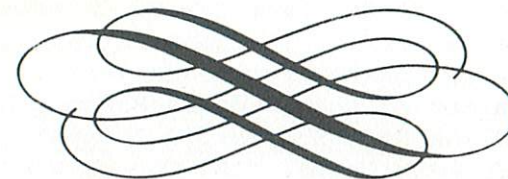
I'd like to leave an afterglow

OBITUARY

On the morning of March 13, 1982 at 11:45 a.m. the angel of silence came to the bedside of Rev. Joel V. Bass at Bolivar Community Hospital, and with chilly fingers sealed the lips of our loved one. His Soul winged its flight from this world of sin, sorrow and pain to a place of eternal life.

Rev. Joel V. Bass, born to the late Rev. Joe and Sis. Lilly Bass November 9, 1903 in Fayette County, Tennessee professed a hope in Christ at an early age and joined the Clover Garden C.M.E. Church.
