The Obituary

JORDEN B. CARNEY, son of the late Sullivan and Irene Carney, was born on December 22, 1917 in Stanton, Tennessee. He was one of seven children. Jorden was educated in Memphis, Tennessee.

He accepted Christ at an early age and was married to Christine Powell.

They moved to Chicago, Illinois where he entered the U.S. Army in 1943 and was honorably discharged with many citations in 1946.

After returning to Chicago, he worked with construction companies until his retirement.

After the death of his wife in December, 1985, he came to Philadelphia, Pennsylvania to live with his sister and brother-in-law and joined Mount Olivet Tabernacle Baptist Church. He loved attending services until he became ill with Alzheimers Disease and was admitted to Coatesville VA Medical Center where he remained until his death on Monday, July 5, 1993.
