Obituary

Brother Dudley L. Baskerville was the third born, December 3, 1913, to the union of the late Arthur Baskerville and Virginia Whitthorne Baskerville in Fayette County, Tennessee.

He accepted Christ at an early age and joined Belmont C.M.E. Church. A portion of his spiritual life was spent at Collins Chapel C.M.E. Church in Covington, Tennessee where he was Chairman of the Steward Board and Chairman of the Building Fund; where he was instrumental in the construction of the Church parsonage.

On returning to Belmont C.M.E. Church, Mr. Baskerville was a dedicated and faithful member. He served as Sunday School Teacher, member of the Steward and Trustee Boards and Chairman of the Building Fund for the Fellowship Building.

He received his early education in the Fayette and Tipton County school systems, and was graduated from Tennessee State University with a Bachelor of Science in Mathematics and Social Studies and later received a Masters in Administration and Supervision. He was highly respected as an educator where he worked in the Fayette and Tipton County school systems as a Principal, teacher and basketball coach for many years.

He served in the United States Army in World War II.

He was a devoted community volunteer, serving in numerous organizations such as T.R.T.A. Association, American Legion, Popular Spring Lodge of Mason, N.A.A.C.P. and Red Cross Chapter, Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

Mr. Baskerville was united in Holy marriage to Odessa Peete. To this union no children were born. Their home was a home to many nephews, nieces and students.

Though his wife preceded him in death in 1989, they spent many happy years together. Mr. Baskerville leaves to cherish his memories three sisters: Leathy Maclin, Stanton, Tennessee; Anna B. Bryson, Nashville, Tennessee; Lucy Anne Watkins, Humboldt, Tennessee; one brother, William Baskerville who preceded him in death; brother and sister-in-law, Rev. & Mrs. Robert E. Peete, Detroit Michigan; a host of nephews, nieces, other relatives and friends; Special Friends Rev. & Mrs. William Bufford.

His family feels blessed to have been the beneficiaries of his love and of his Christian example and will strive to have their lives continue the legacy.
