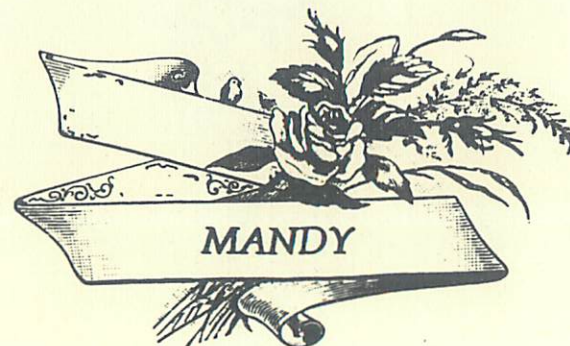


~Obituary~
