

Kerry Lee Gooch, the son of U.L. "Rip" and Augusta Gooch, was born February 27, 1965 in Wichita, Kansas.

Kerry received his early education in the public schools of Wichita and attended Wichita State University. He found his special place at Central State University, Warrensburg, Missouri, in the School of Aviation Technology. Kerry served as a flight instructor in their aviation flight program. He earned a Bachelors of Science Degree and in 1989, Kerry earned a Masters Degree in Aviation Technology. Kerry attended St. Matthew C.M.E. Church.

After graduation, Kerry was employed by Beech Holdings, Inc., a subsidiary of Beech Aircraft Corporation. He was a staff assistant. Kerry enjoyed this position because it gave him the opportunity to do what he enjoyed most---Flying Airplanes.

Kerry joined the Air National Gurad, and later transferred to the Army National Guard. He then entered the Officers Candidate School.

Kerry's first and last love was aviation. He made his first solo flight in a sailplane when he was 14, and flew a powered aircraft when he was 16. Kerry earned both a Commercial Pilot and Flight Instructor Certificate with both multi-engine and instrument ratings.
