

## CROSSING THE BAR

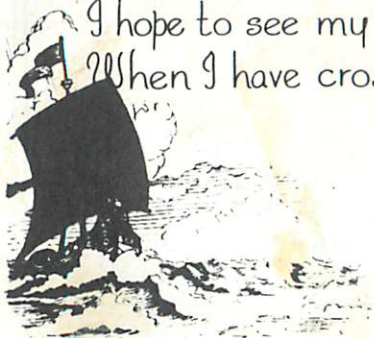
**S**unset and evening star,
